**City of Burton/Davison Township Boil Order Notice – Update # 1**

**December 30, 2017 11:00 a.m. Update**

The Boil Order Notice for the City of Burton and Davison Township remains in effect. Yesterday morning a boil order notice was issued for these two communities after a temporary loss of water pressure occurred. Water pressure was quickly restored, however, regulations required a precautionary boil order to be issued.

The order will remain in effect until our office can confirm two consecutive rounds of 24-hour testing, showing the drinking water in those communities meet or exceed safe drinking water standards. We received the results of the first 24-hour test earlier this morning, which showed drinking water within normal set parameters. We expect the results of the second testing period early tomorrow morning, and will issue an update accordingly.

GCDC can announce that the boil order has been refined, to EXCLUDE residents in the following Burton subdivisions: Maplewoods Meadows, Pebble Creek, Maple Creek, Maple Point, Oak View Meadows Condo, and Maple Leaf Estates Condo. These areas were originally included out of an abundance of caution, however, it has been determined these areas did not lose water pressure, and are no longer under the boil order. They are the ONLY communities in Burton and Davison Township that are excluded. All other residents on the Genesee County Water System in Burton and Davison Township remain on the Boil Order.

We thank all of the affected residents for their patience and cooperation. As a reminder:

**DO NOT DRINK THE WATER WITHOUT BOILING IT FIRST.** Bring all water to a boil, let it boil for one minute, and let it cool before using, or use bottled water. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking, making ice, brushing teeth, washing dishes, and food preparation until further notice. Boiling kills bacteria and other organisms in the water.
